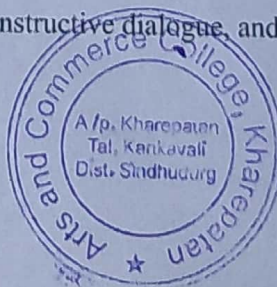
Key Highlights:
